# Gender Sensitization Action Plan for 2023-24

## 1. Vision and Objectives

- Promote gender awareness and inclusivity within the college and local community.
- Empower students with knowledge and skills to combat gender biases and genderbased violence.
- Enhance the participation of women in leadership, skill development, and decisionmaking processes.

## 2. Planned Activities

- 1. Awareness Programs and Workshops
  - **Expert Lecture on Women's Rights and Legal Protections:** Conduct a lecture by a legal expert to educate students about women's laws and rights. Focus on addressing workplace harassment, domestic violence, and cyber safety.
  - **Cancer Awareness Visit:** Organize a visit to a cancer research center to educate students about the importance of early detection and preventive measures, particularly for cervical and breast cancer

# 2. Skill Development and Competitions

- Creative Expression Events: Plan competitions such as Rangoli (with themes on women's empowerment) and Mehendi art to showcase creativity and highlight women's empowerment
- Entrepreneurship and Startup Sessions: Arrange sessions in collaboration with SSIP-IIC / SEP Committee focusing on encouraging female entrepreneurship. Invite successful women entrepreneurs to share their journeys and inspire students

# 3. Self-Defense and Safety Training

- Certificate Course on Self-Defense: Conduct a 30-hour certified self-defense training course for students, teaching them techniques to protect themselves from physical and emotional threats
- **School Outreach Programs:** Extend self-defense training to nearby schools, such as the program planned for Bhamariyapura Primary School girls
- 4. Health and Hygiene Awareness
  - Menstrual Hygiene Workshops: Conduct sensitization sessions on menstrual health and the use of sanitary napkin vending machines and incinerators. Demonstrate their usage and explain their benefits to students

## 5. Cultural and Community Engagement

- **Food Fest:** Organize a food fest to promote community building, teamwork, and inclusivity as well as Entreprenership and Leadership
- **CWDC General Meeting:** Host regular meetings to discuss the progress of initiatives and gather suggestions from students
- 6. Gender Sensitization Drives

• Plan and execute sensitization campaigns focused on reducing gender stereotypes and fostering respect for all genders.

### **3. Implementation Timeline**

Quarter	Activity Focus
April - June	Cancer awareness visit, start-up sessions, and menstrual hygiene workshops.
July - September	Rangoli and Mehndi competitions, general sensitization workshops, and planning for self-defence programs.
October - December	Self-defence certificate courses, entrepreneurship training, and health workshops.
January - March	Final sensitization workshops, outreach to schools for self-defense, and cultural events like food fests.

## 4. Resources

- Partnerships with NGOs, health professionals, and legal experts.
- Financial support for training programs and workshops.
- Collaboration with local schools and institutions.

### 5. Monitoring and Evaluation

- Use feedback forms, surveys, and discussions to assess the impact of each activity.
- Create detailed reports of all events with participation statistics and visual documentation.
- Review outcomes during general meetings.

- Improved awareness of gender issues among students and staff.
- Empowerment of students with self-defense and entrepreneurial skills.
